**Subject: - Dispensation/Relaxation to ASU colleges in unprecedented time of COVID-19 pandemic - reg.**

**Sir/Madam,**

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Further as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder.

Further, Govt. of India, M/o AYUSH vide its letter ref. no. Z 14011/03/2018-Ep(IM-1) dated 26.03.2021 & 15.04.2021, issued Relaxation/support for ASU&S colleges in unprecedented times of COVID-19 pandemic for the session 2021-22, Ministry of AYUSH has given certain relaxations to the ASU&S colleges in respect of Teaching Staff (Higher Faculty), OPD and IPD data and others.

However, keeping in view of Covid-19 Pandemic unprecedented situation and in pursuance of 5<sup>th</sup> meeting of NCISM held on 09.09.2021, following relaxation also being provided to the ASU&S colleges by the NCISM for the year 2021-22 only, in addition to the relaxation provided in MSR 2016, subject to the condition that, **if institute/college avails the relaxation policy given by the Ministry of AYUSH vide its letter ref. no. Z 14011/03/2018-Ep (IM-1) dated 26.03.2021 & 15.04.2021, then the policy issued by the NCISM shall not be applicable for them. The policy is as under:-**

- For 10% deficiency w.r.t. teaching staff, permission may be considered reducing the intake strength by 50%. If deficiency is more than 10% permission shall be denied.
- For 10% deficiency in hospital staff permission may be considered reducing the intake strength by 10%. If deficiency is more than 10% permission shall be denied.
- For 10% deficiency in Non- Teaching staff permission may be considered reducing the intake strength by 10%. If deficiency is more than 10% permission shall be denied.
- For 10% deficiency in instruments, permission may be considered reducing the intake strength by 10%. If deficiency is more than 10% permission shall be denied.
- In case of multiple deficiencies as specified above, then all deficiencies will be added and intake strength will be reduced accordingly.

**NOTE:-**

- The above said Relaxation policy can be availed by the institution at the time of hearing by submitting the application for the same.

Further, it is to inform you that, as per section 10(1) (g) if a person *aggrieved by the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may prefer an appeal to the Commission against such decision within fifteen days of the communication of such decision* and as per section 9(6) of NCISM ACT 2020 "A person who is aggrieved by any decision of the Commission, may prefer an appeal to the Central Government against such decision within fifteen days of the communication of such decision".
